The President's Corner

Rain, rain go away come back another...uhm...next fall. No really...come back next fall, *we have had enough*. The wet weather seems as it is never going to end. It was the plan, based on normal conditions, we would have started our paving projects by now, and we would be enjoying some spring golf on warmer day. But, you can't control Mother Nature!

The paving projects are ready to begin once the weather changes enough to make them possible. These include finishing the parking area, cart paths and the road to the new cart barn. The parking area consists of paving an overlay from the new parking lot to the Sovereign entrance. This roadway will also be widened by an additional two feet. In addition, the dirt mounds along the fence line will be removed and used to build our new # 2 tee. At the east side of the parking lot, the existing pavement along the north practice area will be removed, and new pavement put in place. This will extend from the parking lot to the east almost to the maintenance access road. The new bio-swale worked great this winter, but an overflow to the East of it still needs to be completed. We will also be installing some landscaping around the parking lot. There was a plan to include an overflow parking area, however this is being postponed so we have the money to finish our cart paths.

The cart paths are in terrible shape. The plan was to redo the paths next to tees and greens and along the entire length of par 3's. We rebid the work, and the lower bids allow us to do much more! Based on the proposals, we are now able to complete the path paving, 8 ½ feet wide, on all holes. Some existing paths will be removed over time on holes that have more than one path. Example is hole #1 which has paths on both sides. The one on the right will be eliminated. As time allows, Ryan will remove the paving and rock, and replace it with grass. We will also be the finishing of the new road between the cart barn and cart path next to the warm-up putting green. Once this is done, the carts will not have to use the road to the maintenance building. This will be safer and more convenient.

Expect with better weather, mid May to mid June, lots of activity on these projects. They will create some closures, distractions and inconveniences while being installed, but we are all excited to get these long-awaited improvements completed.

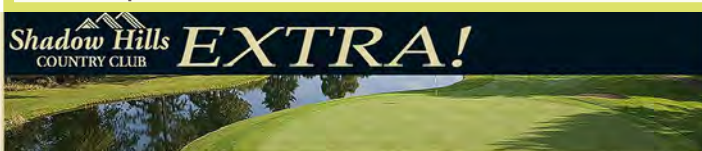

The 2017 OWGA season got off to a great start on April 11th at Columbia Edgewater CC - the first of twenty events that will conclude with the championship tournament in September. Leilani Norman and Kathy Lucier were both Gross Winners. The next event will be May 1st at Arrowhead Golf Club.

OWGA collects contributions to support the OGA's Junior Girls Golf program. So far this year Shadow Hills Women's Club members donated \$412 at our April opening meeting. We expect the total will exceed last year's \$500 when online contributions are tallied later this year. Many thanks to everyone who gave!



As most of you are aware, we will begin the cart path improvement project as soon as the weather allows. One path throughout the entire golf course will be resurfaced with 2" of asphalt. The path width will be 8.5', with wider areas around tees and greens. I know we are all looking forward to a new path as it will enhance the aesthetics of the course, assist in the longevity of the golf carts and provide a much smoother, enjoyable round of golf.

We recently purchased a large sand top dresser. This piece of equipment will allow us to more efficiently sand large areas in the rough. Specifically, cart traffic areas where the carts enter and exit the fairways. In the wet periods of the year, the fairways remain fairly firm and drivable with a golf cart. However, getting to the fairways through the wet, soft rough is the challenge. Over time, our goal is to build a sand base in the soil to firm up these rough areas, improving winter playability and allowing for a more frequent 90 degree cart rule. The new sander will also be used to apply sand in walk off areas from the greens to the cart paths, adding sand to sand traps and the continual sanding of the fairways.

It has been a long, wet winter and spring, but the forecast for the beginning of May looks to be improving! See you on the course.

The Handicap Committee, appointed by officers of our golf club, is responsible for all aspects of the USGA Handicap System. Our Committee includes a Handicap Chair who has been certified by the Oregon Golf Association. We are obligated and committed to ensure the integrity of each Handicap Index we issue. In the interest of fairness, and because we are compelled by our license with the OGA / USGA, we will provide education, as well as uphold the rules of the Handicap System. While this sounds very serious, these regulations are required so our club can assure equity in our games. More equity = *more fun!*

The purpose of the USGA Handicap System is to make the game more enjoyable by enabling players of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis.

The Handicap Committee has set forth the following policies and procedures for all members carrying USGA Handicap Indexes:

- Each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played.
- All acceptable rounds must be posted for peer review, including 9-hole scores.
- Scores must be posted within 72 hours of the round being played.
- Scores must be adjusted properly for handicap purposes - for ESC (Equitable Stroke Control), for holes not played, and for holes that are started but not finished.
- The principles of the Rules of Golf must be followed.

Scores in both match play and stroke play, as well as under 'Preferred Lies / Winter Rules' must be posted for handicap purposes. This includes scores made in match play, in multi-ball, or in team competitions in which players have not completed one or more holes or in which players are requested to pick up when out of contention on a hole.

A player must earn a Handicap Index. No player has an inherent right to a Handicap Index without providing full evidence of ability to our club's Handicap Committee. The Committee has the ultimate authority and obligation to adjust or withdraw a Handicap Index if it deems it necessary to do so.

A complete Handicapping Policies & Procedures will be posted by the computer (between men's and women's locker rooms) soon. Please feel free to contact your Handicap Committee members if you have any questions or concerns. We are committed to helping you anyway we can.
